
AGRICULTURAL in climate change adaptation NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

Climatologists predicted that Extreme drought, intermittent dry spell, late onset, heat waves from Arabian Sea, heavy rain fall and flash flood will be occurred on coming years. In view of the rapidly growing global demand for food, it is estimated that food production has to be doubled by 2050. Some 70% of people who are undernourished rely directly or indirectly on agriculture for their livelihoods; hence it is smallholder farmers who are at risk of undernourishment. The after effects of climate change and related catastrophe is not comfortable for the people especially the vulnerable community in the operational area of Shreyas. In this juncture systematic, scientific, people lead and people owned intervention has to be initiated. Shreyas have a vision, philosophy and objectives on the above said phenomenon and had developed strategies to overcome the issues. 
national and international universities and institutions. Students will undergo trainings at field level mostly with an exposure to community.

SANITATION CAMPAIGN -

To prevent the spreading diseases during monsoon, sanitation campaigns were conducted in the tribal hamlets. Cleaning of the surrounding of the hamlet, well cleaning and Chlorination and drainage construction were the major activities undertaken.



THUDITHALAM

Thudithalam is a folk art group initiative of tribal youth initiated by Shreyas. The group performs tribal art forms and theme based skits for creating awareness among the tribal communities. DETAILS ABOUT THE PROJECT


Through TDF-WADI project the family was given financial assistance of Rs. 13,500/ to buy two buffalos calves under livelihood programme. The family took care of the calves for almost 2 years and when the calves where grown they used the animal for ploughing the land. The animal was used regularly to plough the land and on an average they were able to earn Rs 700/-800/ per day. Apart from that dung from the buffalos is also became an additional source of income for the family as they sold

the dung. Thus the family was able to earn Rs.50000/- annually. With the income from buffalo rearing and loan from the SHG the family started to cultivate the paddy in 2 acres of land. Today the family is able to lead a healthy and happy family. The project has worked as a catalyst in improving the financial condition of the family leading to a chain of positive actions that has made the family to become self reliant. The positive outcome of this project has made the family to venture into new areas. Cultivation of paddy was only a very distant dream for this family but as a result of this project and from the initiative from the family members and with the support of the SHG they have a new beginning in improving their financial condition. Today Mrs. Shantha and her family members are a happy to expand their avenues in terms of their livelihood. They have made use of the project in improving their financial condition.

DETAILS ABOUT THE PROJECT

In 2013 the family was selected for the NABARD-TDF-WADI project. They had a strong desire to start an income generation unit through the project. The assistance of Rs. 13,000/ helped her to start the project. She purchased 2 buffaloes through the assistance given through the project. Now the project provides stable income for their livelihood. Also she was supported with Rs. 5000/ for purchasing chicken. Through the earnings from the dung and egg now she could purchase 2 goats. In the five cent lease land of forest surrounding their house they have a beautiful kitchen garden and cultivates all varieties of seasonal vegetables. They also secured the housing support from the Tribal department and constructed a comfortable shelter. The success of this project gave more confidence to them. Through trainings provided they learned to make organic manure and used it for vegetable garden and get chemical and pesticide free safe food. Mahesh, Santhosh, Vishnu and Asha are studying with good education facilities. It leads them to participate in Gramasaba. Their health condition also improved by including nutrient food like fresh vegetables and eggs,

They could complete their dream house with all basic facilities with the income from the project. They repaid their whole loans and have savings in their sangham. Now they are living in standard living condition. Now they are able to maintain themselves without further assistance.
