## THE NATURE OF FUTURE DEPENDS ON THE FUTURE OF OUR NATURE

*A steady step towards the survival of post flood scenario in conservation, management and equitable utilization of the resource trinity*

The post flood periods of Kerala spread over the light of hope and survival to the people through an unwavering willpower, commitment and exact thinking about the future. Overcoming of crises was huge obstacles but the constant effort helped us to climb ashore. Partner families of Shreyas like small, marginal farmers, tribes, children, youth, senior citizens and person with disabilities were accorded massive effort for the same. The main livelihood source of the above said people are from agriculture and allied sectors. Due to the flooding and other climate change hazardous natural resources and major crop systems and other livelihood interventions have been destructed.

By acquiring new insights from the lessons of the past, we have formulated sustainable and people's participatory movements and brought the same in the heart of the people. The partner families and our institutional system and structures are being intact to bring remarkable results in natural resource management sector. Following are major interventions :

## Jalanidhi- The people lead and people owned initiatives for safe drinking water and sanitation

During the year of 2012, 13 & 14 Govt. of Kerala selected Karuvarakkundu, Noolpuzha, Poothady and Chakkittapara projects respectively to implement the Jalanidhi project to bring remarkable results in drinking water and sanitation sectors. Shreyas, the project supporting agency paid vital role in the mobilisation of rural people to provide potable water, sanitation facilities and capacitate them to own up the operation and management of the asset created. We provided more attention to the inclusion of the vulnerable people especially the tribal community who are facing acute water shortage and lack sanitation facilities in rural area.

Provided technical answer as well as social support to the gramapanchayaths to implement 90 small water supply schemes, 6 large water supply schemes. Through this schemes 9400 families have access to safe drinking water throughout the year. Constructed 1910 individual toilet units as part of open defecation free project, Ground water recharge, school toilets, community and individual bio gas plants, comfort stations, training, capacity building, IEC activities and gramapanchayath strengthening are the major initiatives carried out apart from this formed and strengthened 134 beneficiary groups and acting as local level development agencies.

## Integrated watershed development and management programme

Last 3 decades shreyas has been paid more attention for the integrated watershed development programme. So far 31 watershed projects were implemented with the support of Government and other agencies. NABARD is the major supporting agency in this sector. At present shreyas is being facilitated NABARD KFW Soil Project at Amarakuni Watershed for integration of watershed development for rehabilitation of degraded soils and climate change adaption with the support of German Development Bank (KFW).





## SHREYAS COMMUNITY BASED ORGANISATIONS

Self-governed, peer controlled, informal group of people with same socio-economic background and having a desire to collectively perform common purposes constitute SHG which is a holistic programme of micro-enterprises covering all aspects of self-employment organizes rural poor into self Help groups and their capacity building, planning of activity clusters, infrastructure build up, technology, credit and marketing.

In 1981 Shreyas initiated Farm clubs and mahila samajams. Later it developed as NHG in 1994 and as SHG in 1996. There are diverse activities for SHG such as Monthly monitoring and evaluation, Agriculture development programme, Charity, Entrepreneurship development programme, Health and education development programmes, children and youth development programmes. 1717 women headed SHGs is an achievement in attaining Gender development. Elderly citizens and PwDs were given special exposure and care through these SHGs. Youth, Children SHGs promoted the holistic development of them and capacitated them as innovative, energized and active groups towards self actualization and self reliance. Skill trainings, Health awareness camps, career guidance supported nearly 1546 folks.

# SHREYAS DISASTER MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

Shreyas took the baton in the Humanitarian assistance during Flood 2019 which was worse than Flood 2018. Severity doesn't set our limits; rather intervened in every point we could act since Disaster management remains one of the core expertises of Shreyas. We kept on changing and transforming lives through our Pre and Post Disaster interventions. Not only mere supports, we continued our actions through capacitating the people in Disaster prone areas with Disaster Risk Reduction and Disaster Preparedness thereby developing Disaster resilient communities. Caritas India, Care India, Oxfam, Americares were ensured there cooperation in flood rehabilitation. Wayanad District Inter Agency Group (IAG), DDMA/SDMA are paid vital role to survive the disasters through various participatory actions.

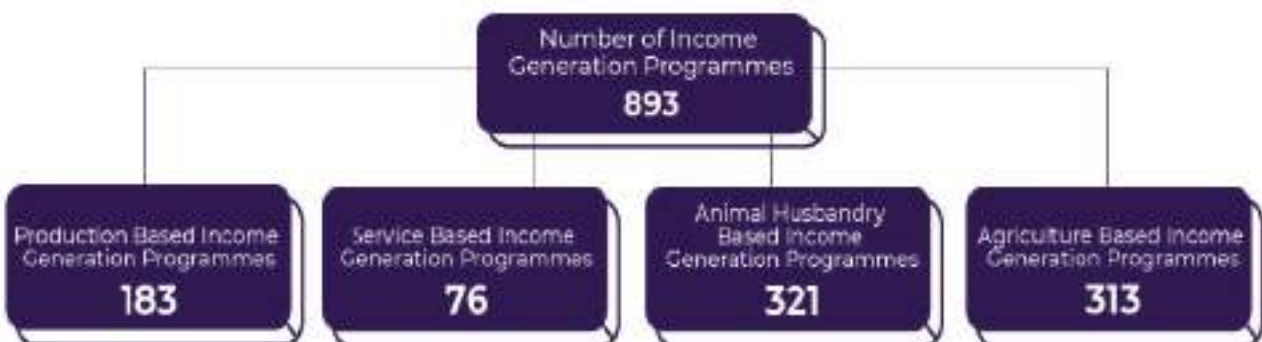


# SHREYAS ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Rural employment and income are adversely affected by natural calamities like unpredictable climatic changes and flash flood, wild animal attack, fluctuation in the market, abandonment of agriculture by farmers due to the above said issues. Hence, people don't have a regular job to generate their income. The introduction of income generation programs by the Shreyas helps them to have a fixed return for low income families. Shreyas launched certain package of resources to exploit an opportunity through entrepreneurship development trainings.

Micro enterprises play an important role in employment creation and income generation. Such small scale enterprises can boost up the economy against economic crisis such as low per capita income, poverty and unemployment. Micro enterprises aim to bring about overall improvement in the quality of life of the people, through employment and income generation, skill and strengthening of livelihoods opportunities. Through the Entrepreneurship development programme Shreyas helped the beneficiaries to achieve the following sustainable development goals No poverty, Zero hunger, decent work and economic growth and Gender equality. 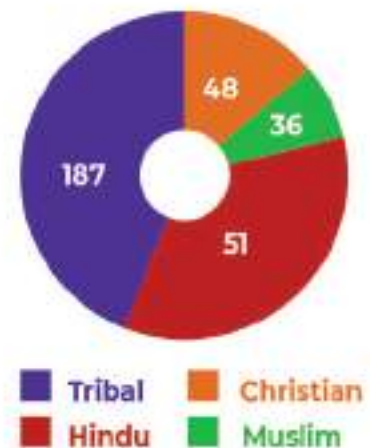

# SHREYAS EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Shreyas Educational Programme is committed to transforming the lives of marginalised children. Shreyas field. Trainings to secondary and higher secondary students, 325 students were provided study materials, career guidance classes, providing financial aid to the financially backward students etc. Financial aid as loan provided to 156 students of backward classes. 85 Secondary and 71 higher secondary merit holders were honoured.

# SHREYAS PROGRAMMES FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITY

## INTRODUCTION

Inclusion of Persons with Disability is one of the major sustainable development goals (SDGs) agreed by U.N. SHREYAS is working for the Person With Disabilities (PwDs) since 2002 and professional assistance and support have been our key areas of intervention so far. We deliver professional services to empower PwDs and to rehabilitate them to the mainstream society. We support and handhold PwDs in five northern districts of Kerala through special SHGs and innovative projects and programmes. The ultimate objective of this programme is to help them to be independent in the society. We particularly work for Persons with deaf blindness (PwD) since 2016. We provide special education, vocational training, Income generation training and awareness creation especially under this programme.



## EARLY SCREENING & INTERVENTION PROGRAMME

The early screening programme initiated in 2018 with the support from Sense India and in partnership with Fatima Hospital, Kalpetta. This programme is aimed at screening infants with hearing impairment. Advanced Sohum Machine can detect hearing loss for infants at greater accuracy. 150 infants are screened monthly on an average. Children with hearing impairment will be referred for further assessment and treatment.

## SHREYAS RESOURCE CENTRE

Resource Centre for Children and adults with disabilities especially deafblindness operate at SHREYAS. Services like Special education, physiotherapy, speech therapy and occupational therapy are provided by the professionals. A well furnished resource centre occupy latest devices and teaching learning materials (TLMs) for advance training. This is supported by Sense India.

# SHREYAS TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The tribes are children of nature and their lifestyle is conditioned by the Ecosystem. Processes of social exclusion, driven by multiple economic, social, political and cultural factors, play a major role in entrenching inequalities of outcome and opportunity. Social exclusion denies many, including indigenous peoples. On this context Shreyas has many interventions for the integrated development of tribal community. Educational Promotional activities for children reduced school drop outs of tribal children. Shreyas is a part of the committee for monitoring the atrocities against tribals in Wayanad. Different issues of the tribal community have been dealt by the committee. Raised and submitted complaints against illicit liquor and drug abuse in a tribal hamlets at Chukkalikkuni. We assisted 547 tribal families to obtain viable income generation programs. 34 Wells cleaned and chlorinated, Constructed Drainage, Renovated Ponds as part of flood relief activities. Thudithalam is a folk art group of tribal youth initiated by Shreyas. The group performs tribal art forms and theme based skits for creating awareness among the tribal community. The professional troop has performed programmes as part of water conservation campaign and Jalanidhi project.

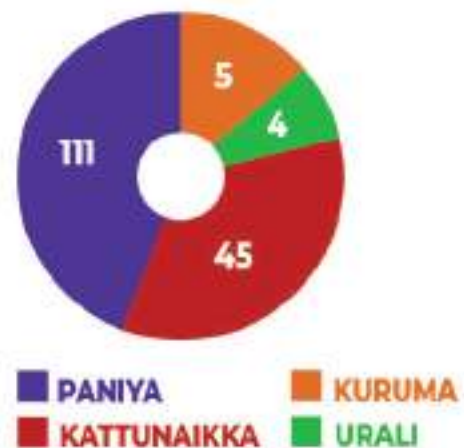
